Foreword

This Ordo aims to give simple directions for our friars of the Province – which includes Australia, New Zealand, Solomon Islands and Papua New Guinea - *in the dioceses in which we have foundations*. Friars travelling in other dioceses will still need to consult local calendars.

As well as the *General Roman Calendar* and the *Calendar* of our Order, local celebrations and local patrons have been included where they are known. Also included are liturgical directives or advice, drawn from the liturgical books of the Roman Rite or our Order, and the documents of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments, including the 2002 *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. These indications are included to draw attention to easily neglected or misunderstood provisions. They are not complete, nor do they always refer to the most important aspects of liturgy. Recourse should always be had to the original documents.

This year's *Ordo* includes several new celebrations for Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands, namely St Arnold Janssen (15 January), Mary, Mother of the Church (Saturday after Pentecost) and Bl John Mazzuconi (25 Sep.), and Bl. Peter To Rot has been raised in grade to a Feast. [cf. *Notitiae*, vol. 509-510, (Jan – Feb 2009), p. 39.]

According to the desire of St Dominic, the solemn and common celebration of the liturgy must be maintained among the principal duties of our vocation.

In the liturgy, especially in the Eucharist, the mystery of salvation is present and at work, a mystery in which we share and which we contemplate and proclaim in preaching to others so that they may be incorporated into Christ through the sacraments of faith.

In the liturgy, together with Christ, we glorify God for the eternal plan of the divine will and for the wonderful order of grace, and we intercede with the Father of mercies for the entire Church as well as for the needs and the salvation of the whole world. Therefore, the celebration of the liturgy is the center and heart of our whole life, whose unity especially is rooted in it.

INTRODUCTION

This Liturgical Calendar follows the *Roman Calendar* and the proper *Calendar of the Order of Preachers*, adapted for use in Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Solomon Islands by the inclusion of celebrations proper to the Order and celebrations proper to those countries.

Local celebrations (titular feasts, diocesan patrons, anniversaries of dedication etc.) are shown for those places where the Province has foundations. Those working or living in other places need to consult local calendars for local variations.

I. The Calendar:

Certain celebrations have proper **Vigil Masses**. These Vigil Masses are intended to be used either before or after Evening Prayer I. For pastoral reasons, it is permitted to use the Mass of the Day in place of the Vigil Mass (except, of course, for the Easter Vigil.)

On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when there is no obligatory memorial, an **optional memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary** is encouraged. The votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary proper to the Order, or a Mass from *the Collection of Masses in Honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary* may be used. For the Office, the proper offices in the Liturgy of the Hours or the votive offices of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the *Dominican Supplement* may be used.

II. Patronal Feasts and Solemnities:

A community should celebrate the following:

- Solemnity of the Anniversary of the Dedication of the church on the anniversary day of the dedication, if the church was consecrated. If the day of dedication is unknown, this solemnity is observed on Oct 22;
- Solemnity of the titular saint of the church;
- Solemnity of the principal patron of their house;
- Feast of the Anniversary of the Dedication of the cathedral;
- Feast of the principal patron of the diocese, territory, province, or more extensive territory.

III. Typography of this Calendar:

- A. *Italics*: indicate an element of the liturgy of the day which is optional, e.g., *sequence*; or they indicate an Optional Memorial, e.g., Dec 4, *St John of Damascus*. They are also used for words in languages other than English, e.g. *Te Deum*.
- B. Explanatory material is set in slightly smaller type.
- C. The letters **OP** in the margin indicate a celebration or rubrical directions proper to the Order.
- D. Celebrations belonging to a particular church or place are placed in a grey box.
- E. Blesseds on the *Calendar for the Provinces* (which is a supplement to the Martyrology - cf. *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, n. 355) appear in smaller print, with no rank.
- F. *Anniversaries of deceased Masters of the Order appear in italics, with the note "Obit"*.
- G. *Anniversaries of deceased friars of the province appear in italics, with the note "Anniv"*.

SPECIAL INDULGENCES FOR THE ORDER

A **plenary indulgence**, under the usual conditions, may be gained by a brother who makes or renews, at least privately, his intention to fulfil faithfully the duties of his vocation:

For the whole Order:

- on the feasts of the Birth of the Lord, Easter, Annunciation, Assumption of B. V. Mary, St Dominic, St Thomas Aquinas, St Catherine of Siena and All Saints of the Order;
- on the occasion of a General Chapter.

For the individual houses:

- on the feast of the principal patron of the house;
- on the feast of saints or blessed whose body or principal relics are kept there;
- at the end of regular visitation.

For individual brothers:

- on the day of entering the novitiate
- on the day of first profession and the day of solemn profession;
- on the 25th, 50th, 60th and 75th anniversary of first profession.

Candles may be distributed before the rite, or after the blessing. The *Prayer of Blessing* and the procession with stations may be observed with our proper chants, as set out in the Dominican Proper. At Mass the sequence *Laetabundus* may be used.

The custom of the *offering of candles* in our tradition represents openness of our hearts to the Lord. If this is followed, the brethren and faithful hold the lighted candles in their hands until the rite of offering, which occurs while the Offertory chant is sung. At Evening Prayer, the prose *Inviolata* may be sung after the short reading, after or in place of the responsory.

SEASON OF LENT

Lent is a penitential season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in preparation for Easter.

During Lent *Alleluia* is always omitted at Mass and Office. The *Gloria* is said at Mass only on solemnities and feasts. The organ is used only to sustain singing, and floral decoration is not permitted (except on solemnities and on *Laetare* Sunday.) PS 25.

The *Prayer over the People* at the end of Mass is recommended on weekdays.

Catholics over the age of reason are required to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. (CIC 920 #1); in Australia and New Zealand, between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday.

OP

Penitential practices during Lent:

According to Church Law, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are observed as days of fast and abstinence. According to the Statue of the Province (n. 10), all the Fridays in Lent are days of fast and abstinence for the brethren. The House Chapter is to decide other forms of community penance for Lent. (LCO 49, - III)

OP

Night Prayer in Lent:

If Night Prayer is sung, the *In pace* response may be used in place of "Into your hands." The antiphons *Evigila* or *O Rex* may be used in place of the gospel canticle antiphon "Save us."

If Night Prayer is not sung, the antiphons *Evigila* and *O Rex* may be used for the gospel canticle at Evening Prayer in place of the regular antiphon at Evening Prayer I and II of Sundays of Lent.

The chant *Media vita* may be used in place of the short response at Night Prayer or at Evening Prayer, or even at other celebrations, such as a penitential liturgy on Ash Wednesday or on Thursday of Holy Week (before the beginning of the Easter Triduum).

The celebrant blesses and distributes ashes after the homily. Other persons may be associated with the bishop or priest in the imposition of ashes, e.g., deacons, special ministers of communion and other lay persons, when there is true pastoral need.

Special ministers of communion and deacons may bring blessed ashes to the sick and those confined to their homes. If a minister is not available, a member of the family or another person may bring the blessed ashes to a shut-in, using one of the formulas in the Sacramentary to impose ashes.

OP

For pastoral reasons the blessing and distribution of ashes may take place outside Mass. In this case it may be appropriately joined to some hour of the Office, especially Midday Prayer or the Office of Readings.

If it seems appropriate, on Ash Wednesday or on other days during Lent, in place of the former rite of the penitential psalms, some communal penitential celebration or "rite of reconciliation" may be held, whether sacramental or non-sacramental (according to the spirit of the *Rite of Penance*, nn.36 - 37). This celebration may not immediately precede Mass.

In place of the rite for blessing and imposing ashes in the Roman Missal, that in the Dominican Supplement may be used, including our proper prayer of blessing.

NB:

When the blessing and distribution of ashes takes place outside Mass and apart from an hour of the Office, the entire liturgy of the word should be celebrated: entrance song, opening prayer, readings and chants, homily, blessing and distribution of ashes, and general intercessions.

The Chrism Mass may be celebrated in the morning, or on another day earlier this week. White vestments are worn. It is especially fitting that priests concelebrate with the bishop. Priests may communicate under both species, even if not concelebrating.

Apart from the Chrism Mass and the Mass of the Last Supper, all Masses are prohibited, unless the Ordinary permits a second Mass, exclusively for those unable to participate in the Evening Mass. Funerals can only be celebrated without Mass.

Hours of the day. At Office of Readings, the psalms and antiphons of Friday, Week III, may be used.

OP

Today or on another day of this week, some communal penitential celebration or "rite of reconciliation" may be held, whether it be sacramental or non-sacramental (according to the spirit of the *Rite of Penance*, nn.36-37). However, this celebration may not immediately precede Mass.

EASTER TRIDUUM

OP

1. The Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. (RC, n.18)
2. The Easter Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. (RC, n.19)
3. During these days it is desirable that brothers and sisters "who experience the mystery of suffering" should share in and be participants in the liturgical celebrations of the community, especially if they are in the hospital, "that they may be helped to know the meaning of this reality which they live in union with the paschal mystery of Christ."
4. Therefore, keeping in mind their varying conditions and different circumstances, everything should be so arranged that in the most suitable manner the sick may have the possibility of receiving Communion and, if possible, participating in the veneration of the Cross on Good Friday. The various faculties found in the *Ritual* should be freely used. Indeed our concern which is manifested through our care and prayer furnishes the strongest testimony to all that such concern flows from the gospel, our faith in God, and the power of the resurrection.

Throughout the Triduum, the major prelate presides at the principal hours of the Office and at Mass. The principal hours of the Office begin on the right side of choir.

white

Holy Thursday (evening)

Mass of the Lord's Supper. *Gloria*, creed, Preface of Eucharist I, special *Communicantes*, *Hanc Igitur* and *Qui pridie* in Eucharistic Prayer I.

Readings:

Exod 12:1-8, 11-14; Ps 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18; 1 Cor 11:23-26; John 13:1-15

Today the reading of the *Martyrology* is omitted.

The tabernacle should be completely empty before the celebration. Enough hosts for the communion of the faithful for tonight and tomorrow should be consecrated during that celebration. For the reservation of the Blessed Sacrament, a place should be prepared and adorned. When the tabernacle is in a chapel separated from the central part of the church, it is appropriate to prepare the place of repose and adoration there. [PS 49] Candles should be provided for the concelebrants and brethren to carry in the procession. All priests may concelebrate the Mass. Bells may be rung during the *Gloria*, and are silent thereafter.

The *mandatum* - the washing of the feet of the brethren [or laity] - may take place before or after the homily.

OP

Gifts for the poor, especially those collected during Lent as the fruit of penance, may be presented in the offertory procession while the people sing *Ubi caritas*. [PS 52]

After the Prayer After Communion, the greeting, blessing and dismissal are omitted. The celebrant incenses the Blessed Sacrament three times, receives the humeral veil and the procession follows as in the Missal. The cross-bearer goes first, [PS 54], then the [laity and] brethren carrying candles, and the Blessed Sacrament accompanied by torches and incense.

OP

The brethren and faithful are encouraged, after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, to spend a suitable period of time during the night in the church in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament that has been solemnly reserved. Solemn adoration ends at midnight; the Blessed Sacrament remains at the Place of Repose until the Liturgical Action of Good Friday.

OP

Today and tomorrow after Night Prayer, the blessing is not given, the antiphon *Salve Regina* is omitted, and holy water is not used.

OP

The *Sermo Dominicus* (Jn. 13-17) may be used at table or as the last celebration of the day. In this case it is read in place of Night Prayer with the community gathered before the Blessed Sacrament. [cf. PS 56]

Apr 2 Friday

red

GOOD FRIDAY - "Preparation Day"

Day of fast and abstinence. Celebration of the Mass and the sacraments is strictly prohibited, except for Penance and Anointing of the Sick. Communion may be taken to the sick, but otherwise is not distributed outside today's Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

OP

Hours of the day. At Morning Prayer, the *Litany Verses* from the Dominican Supplement may replace the Intercessions. If so, after *Mortem autem crucis* all pause and kneel in silence; then the Lord's Prayer is said aloud, and the Hour concludes as usual.

Today the reading of the *Martyrology* is omitted.

Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

The celebration has three parts:

I. Liturgy of the Word (readings, homily, intercessions)

II. Veneration of the Cross

III. Holy Communion.

The celebration begins about 3 p.m. The altar is completely bare, without candles, cloth or cross. The ministers enter in silence and prostrate before the altar. This act of prostration, which is proper to the rite of the day, should be strictly observed for it signifies both the abasement of "earthly man," and also the grief and sorrow of the Church. As the ministers enter, the faithful should be standing, and thereafter should kneel in silent prayer. [PS 65]

Isa 52:13-53:12; Ps 31:2+6, 12-13, 15-16, 17+25; Heb 4:14-16; 5:7-9; John 18:1-19:42

The Intercessions must follow "the form and wording" handed down by tradition, but the celebrant may make a selection of some more relevant to local conditions, provided the range of intentions is preserved. [PS 67]

The cross is presented to each of the faithful individually for their adoration, since the personal adoration of the cross is a most important feature in this celebration. Only if necessitated by the large numbers of faithful present may the rite of veneration be made simultaneously by all present. Only one cross should be used for the veneration. [PS 69]

OP For the veneration of the cross the rite proper to our Order may be used instead of one of the two forms given in the Roman Missal. (See the *Dominican Supplement*.)

The communion rite is as described in the Missal. The sign of peace is not exchanged.

After Holy Communion, the Blessed Sacrament is carried from the church by a priest or deacon wearing a humeral veil and accompanied by two candles. The Sacrament is reserved privately outside the church for the needs of the sick and dying.

The altar is stripped at a suitable time, but the cross remains with four candles, placed so that the faithful may venerate and kiss it and spend some time in meditation. [PS71]

OP Night Prayer is said after the Celebration of the Lord's Passion at a suitable hour, with two candles alight; the blessing is not given, the antiphon *Salve Regina* is omitted, and holy water is not used.

OP Today after the Veneration of the Cross the brethren, when entering and leaving choir, bow profoundly to the cross as on other days, but they do not genuflect.

OP *De profundis* for deceased brothers and benefactors and *Fidelium* are omitted at grace for meals. The custom of wearing the cappa in the refectory may be observed.

HOLY SATURDAY

Fast is observed if possible. [CR 20] Celebration of the Mass and the sacraments is strictly prohibited, except for Penance and Anointing of the Sick.

Holy Communion may be given only as viaticum.

Hours of the day. Today the reading of the *Martyrology* is omitted.

Night Prayer is celebrated only by those not present at the Vigil.

OP At Morning Prayer, the *Litany Verses* from the *Dominican Supplement* may replace the Intercessions. If so, after *Mortem autem crucis* all pause and kneel in silence; then the Lord's Prayer is said aloud, and the Hour concludes as usual.

Preparation for the Vigil includes: preparation of the bonfire and paschal candle; candles for the brethren and laity; water for the liturgy of Baptism; flowers and decorations for the altar.

EASTER SEASON

white

The Easter Vigil.

The Vigil has four parts:

- I. Service of Light : Bonfire, Procession with Candle, *Exsultet*.
- II. Liturgy of the Word : Readings, psalms, prayers, *Gloria*, homily.
- III. Liturgy of Baptism : Litany, Blessing of Water, Baptism and/or Confirmation, Renewal of Promises, Prayer of the Faithful.
- IV. Liturgy of the Eucharist : Preface of Easter I ("on this Easter night"), special Communicantes and Hanc igitur; double *alleluia* at dismissal.

This liturgical order must not be changed by anyone on his own initiative. [PS 81]
The celebration should truly have the character of a *Vigil*. It must take place *at night*; to start earlier (e.g. at the customary time for a Sunday vigil Mass) is a "reprehensible abuse". [PS 78]

OP

The *Exsultet* may be sung with the melody proper to the Order. Other variations are proposed in the *Dominican Supplement* : e.g. the Litany may be sung, even when there are no baptisms and no font; Dominican saints and certain invocations are added to the Litany. Wherever possible, all the readings should be read so that the character of the Easter Vigil, which demands that it be somewhat prolonged, be respected at all costs. Where pastoral conditions require that the number of readings be reduced, there should be at least three readings from the Old Testament, taken from the law and the prophets; and the reading from Exodus (ch. 14) with its canticle, must never be omitted.

6. Bar 3:9-15, 32-4:4 with Ps 19:8, 9, 10, 11
7. Ezek 36:16-17a, 18-28 with Ps 42:3, 5; 43:3, 4 or Ps 51:12-13, 14-15, 18-19
8. Epistle: Rom 6:3-11
9. Alleluia Psalm: Ps 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23
10. Gospel: Luke 24:1-12

OP

Bells are rung during the *Gloria*, and the altar candles lit; the brethren put off their capps if they are wearing them.

The celebrant - or, in case of necessity, a cantor - intones the triple *alleluia* before the Gospel. The gospel is honoured with incense, but candles are not carried. For integrating the rites of Baptism and Confirmation, see the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, esp. Appendix 1.

The dismissal with double *alleluia* is used tonight and throughout the octave.

The Paschal Candle burns at all Hours and Masses today. It is kept in the sanctuary near the altar or ambo until Pentecost Sunday. [PS 99]

OP

Hours of Easter Sunday.

The Easter Vigil takes the place of the Office of Readings. The chant *Christus resurgens* may be sung at the end of Vespers, followed by *Regina caeli*, with or without a procession.

Where it is the custom, the tradition of "Baptismal Vespers" with a procession to the font is to be diligently observed. (IGLH, 213)

The Martyrology reading begins with the proclamation of the Resurrection, "This day, which was made by the Lord ..." and then follows the announcement of the date, moon and saints of tomorrow.

OP

After Night Prayer the paschal candle is extinguished. It remains by the ambo or altar, and is lit throughout the Easter season at Mass and at the principal hours of the Office until Pentecost inclusive.

OP

Plenary indulgence under usual conditions for brethren who renew, at least privately, their resolve to fulfil faithfully the duties of their vocation.

with that same joy we now proclaim the resurrection of our Saviour:
On the seventeenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday,
and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Season of Lent.
On the fourth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day,
the Holy Passover of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
On the sixteenth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
On the twenty-third day of May the feast of Pentecost;
on the sixth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.
On the twenty-eighth day of November the first Sunday of the Advent of our Lord, Jesus Christ,
to whom be honour and glory in all times and all ages. Amen.

APPENDIX II

PRAYER DEDICATING THE ORDER OF PREACHERS TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY
